Rent



Earlier this year, the Rent Guidance Board has more than doubled the maximum percentage for rent increase on a renewed lease. Half of even the rent stabilized tenants are rent burdened, shelling out over 30% of their household income. A third of rent stabilized tenants are paying over 50%.

This displacement from safe housing takes many forms, and disproportionately targets older, especially Black and brown, working class tenants who have been living in their apartment for decades.

Rent is a way that the state controls how we live.



Landlords are keeping buildings vacant so that they can raise the rents endlessly.

CHIP, or "Community Housing Improvement Program," is an organization of 4000 landlords spearheading a campaign to end rent-stabilization by hoarding over 400,000 rent-stabilized buildings in NYC. (This is called warehousing.)

Rent stabilization is crucial to keeping families in their homes and fighting for a city that is liveable for ALL New Yorkers.

we need to abolish the system of landlordism.

We must fight for collective control of our housing.



No legislation is going to keep us safe and housed. Talk to your neighbors about forming a tenant association, look up your local tenant union or eviction defense group, and start dreaming of and working towards a world where not only CHIP, but all landlords, are obsolete. We are the only ones who can change the city's relationship to housing and bring about a world in which working class New Yorkers control our own housing and destiny.
